PUBLIC HEARINGS AND APPEALS

This is the date set for a public hearing to consider the formation of a Lake Management District for American Lake.

Speaking before Council were:

Jeff Cox, Silcox Island Association President, spoke on behalf of 26 property owners, who support of the formation of a Lake Management District for American Lake. He complimented the city for the efforts taken to secure grant funding.

Sandra Postel, Lakewood resident, spoke in support of the formation of a Lake Management District for the American Lake.

Kurt Spingath, Lakewood resident and American Lake Improvement Club President, spoke in support of the formation of a Lake Management District for American Lake.

Amy Paulson, Lakewood resident, spoke about stopping the tax at ten years and asked whether there a plan to increase fees for lake users who are not property owners in the district and whether fees will be accessed for the Camp Murray and JBLM portion of the Lake.

Janet Springath, Lakewood resident, spoke in support of the formation of a Lake Management District of American Lake.

Trever Walker, Lakewood resident, spoke about the need to address where the milfoil is coming from and asked whether users of the lake will be taxed for use of the lake.

Paul Krakow, Lakewood resident, spoke in support of the treatment of the milfoil and of the formation of a Lake Management District for American Lake.

Kim Rasmussen, Lakewood resident, is opposed to the application of herbicides to the lake and questioned the long term impact of the application to residents and wildlife.

Don Russell, Lakewood resident, spoke in support of the application of herbicide to the lake and complimented the city for the efforts taken to secure grant funding.

There being no further testimony the hearing was declared closed at 7:23 p.m.
